March 20th, 2024 NMSR Meeting: The Total Solar Eclipse of April 8, 2024: Plans, Preparations, Past Eclipses

The April 8th meeting featured several photographs of past eclipses, a discussion on Flat Earth misconceptions regarding eclipses, and a preview of the April 8th Total Eclipse.

Shadow of the earth during the Beaver Moon eclipse of November 19th, 2021 shows relative sizes of Earth and Moon.





Eclipses are only possible when the moon's orbital plane align's with Earth's orbital plane, which occurs twice a year. Furthermore, the moon must be either full or new at these times for eclipses to occur

these times for eclipses to occur.



Flat Earthers say the 2017 eclipse should not have progressed west-to-east as it did. But, as the diagram below shows, the west-to-east speed of the shadow due to moon's orbit around earth (~2200 mph) exceeds the eastto-west speed of the shadow on the earth (~1000 mph) due to earth's daily rotation about its axis.
