NMSR September 18th Meeting: Dr. Trish Henning, on "The Very Large Array, from the Past to the Next Generation"



New Mexico is home to one of the planet's most important astronomical observatories, the Karl G. Jansky Very Large Array telescope, led by the U.S. National Science Foundation National Radio

Astronomy Observatory. Dr. Henning will discuss how the Very Large Array has been making remarkable discoveries about the Universe for over 40 years, and also describe the powerful Very Long Baseline Array, a continent-wide radio telescope headquartered in New Mexico. Finally, she will present a future facility called the next generation VLA, which will improve our view of the radio Universe ten-fold, deep into the 21st century.



The September Bonus: What is the expected value for rolling a pair of fair, 8-sided dice?


August Bonus Solution: "The Rendezvous" Submitted by K. Sengupta

The August Bonus: Determine the time when all the four friends will meet for the first time.




Answer: 4 hours on the nose.

Judith Polich is a former lawyer and an environmentalist. She is a wetlands advocate and a member of the New Mexico State Parks Advisory board. She has a Master of Science degree in Environmental Studies and Environmental Education and a Law degree from the University of Wisconsin.

Her climate change column, "Cutting Your Carbon Footprint" is published in the Albuquerque Journal. Her latest book , entitled Why Can't We Be More Like Trees, explores new climate change narratives.


